



All the places in this book are actual place names on official United States Geological Survey (USGS) topographic maps. Look ‘em up if you don’t believe me! All the maps are unretouched.


Most maps show small, unincorporated towns, that may not even be there any more, but are still on the map. Others show streams, hills, etc.


1 – Something funny is going on

Bogus Corners, PA, near Erie.


Origin: A settler's name?

Dummer, NH, in Coos County.


Named for Massachusetts Governor William Dummer.

Humorist, WA, near Pasco.


Origin: Your guess is as good as mine!

Rotten Bananas Butte, AZ, Navajo County.


Named after an incident?

Looneyville, TX, northwest of Nacogdoches.


Origin: Probably a settler's surname.

Someone's name, I suppose, or just humor?




Folks here are a bit squirrely, I bet.

Okay, OK, Waggoner County.


Origin: Someone thought it was cute, I guess.

Brat Hollow School, NY, Albany County.


Origin: Possibly from an earlier Dutch place name?

Bratt Middle School, FL, Escambia County.


Origin: Probably a name.

Fairy and Fairy Cemetery, TX, Hamilton County.


Origin: Imagination got the better of someone?

Lively Cemetery, KY, Anderson County.


Origin: Settler's name or name of a settlement?

Bungee Lake, etc. Windham County CT.


A family name, perhaps?




I've heard that a lot of guys make these.

Said to be lots of locoweed there.



Lick Bottom, KY, Meade County.


Presumably a creek bottom with a mineral lick.

Bloody Dick Creek, MT, Beaverhead County.


Somebody's nickname?

Yellow Water Canyon, AZ, Navajo Reservation.


Descriptive, I suppose.

Sugartit, KY, Boone County.


Origin: Unknown but possibly from an old type of candy of that name.

Big Dick Point, ID, south of Wallace.


Origin: Lost in obscurity, or at least no one is saying.

Big Johnson and Little Johnson creeks, CO, west of Montrose.


Origin: Obvious I guess.

Big Dick Canyon, AZ, Yuma County.


Origin: Someone's nickname?

Hooker Hole, LA, near Bastrop.


Named after someone named Hooker, I hope.

Origin: Named after Little Dick, I guess.




Maybe Little Dick lives here.

Mianus, CT, near Stamford.


From a native leader's name.

Gay Head, MA, on Martha's Vineyard Island.


Origin: "Head" is a shoreline bluff, "gay" was used for "colorful." Nearby are colorful sandstone cliffs.

Wet Beaver Creek, AZ, west of Cottonwood.


Origin: The flowing branch of Beaver Creek – yes, there is a Dry Beaver Creek.

Intercourse, AL, south of York.


Origin: So called because it was a crossroads and a good place for *social* intercourse – hey, you have a dirty mind.

Love Knob, NC, mountain west of Boone.


Origin: Someone’s surname?

Maidenform Peak, WY, Grand Teton NP.


Origin: unsure but the name “Grand Teton” is thought to refer to breasts.

Johnsons Cutoff, Wabash River, IN – IL border.


Origin: A “cutoff” is a natural or man-made river straightening.

Sandy Bottom Overlook, VA, Shenandoah NP.


Origin: Overlooks Sandy Bottom, of course.

Earp, CA, San Bernardino County.


Origin: Named after Wyatt?

Kinky Creek, WY, Sublette County.


Origin: Descriptive of the course.

Pickens Nose, NC, Macon County.


Origin: “Nose” is used for mountains of a certain shape, this one named after a Ms. Or Mr. Pickens.

Pee Pee Creek, Pike County, Ohio.


See my attempt to explain Pee Pee Township.

So many rivers in Alaska you need to number them maybe?




And talk about being up Shit Creek.

Crackertown, FL, west of Ocala.


Origin: Uncertain but some social stratification between “Crackertown” and nearby “Yankeetown” might be assumed.

Greaser Canyon, OR, Lake County.


A job title in the old west maybe?

Dirty Woman Creek, CO, near Colorado Springs.


Origin: Colorful story I’m sure!

Darkies Creek, IL, Coles County.


Origin: Probably an early settlement of freed or escaped slaves.

Faggot Hill, MA, Boyleston.


Origin: Faggot meant a bundle of firewood, could come from that.

Swastika Lake, WY, Albany County.


Hard to say.

Origin: Someone's politics? A shape on the mountainside?




Settled by Frenchmen?

Must be a good story.


4 – Truth in advertising?

Burns Flat, OK, Washita County.


Origin: Settled by Mr. Burns, I guess.

Worstville, OH, Paulding County.


Origin: I'm at a blank here.

Worry, NC, north of Morganstown.


Origin: Probably the attitude of the earliest settlers.

Bleak, VA, near Remington.


Origin: Maybe a settler's name, or just the aspect of the area?

Origin: Probably some buildings were too close together or something.




Thirsty?

Accident, MD, near Garrett.


Origin: Said to have been come upon by accident by the first settler, who liked the spot.

Chunky Gal Mountain, NC – a few miles west of Big Butt.


Origin: From “chunkey,” a name for a Cherokee gambling game.

Boring, OR, outside Portland.


Origin: Early settler's surname.

Tiny Town, CO, west of Denver.


Origin: Named for a popular miniature village.

Uncertain, TX, on Caddo Lake.


Origin: Given its name by confused surveyors.

Hard Cash, GA, Elbert County.


Origin: Must have been a story behind it.

Origin: Descriptive?




Exciting place to visit, I'm sure.

Origin: I haven't found any origin but must be a good story.




Good place to start a health spa.

Roach Cemetery, IL, Logan County.


A private graveyard for the Roach family, I assume.

Skol Pouch Run, OH, Brown County.


Probably an incident or a prominent advertisement.

Origin: Perceived shades of the rock.




I'll bet there are some odors around here.

Origin: I see mines on the map...




Want something to drink with that?

Origin: Soda lakes are alkaline; this one must have a gruesome story.


6 – Settled on Halloween?

Dead Mans Wash and US Highway 666, NM, Navajo Reservation.


Origin: Probably descriptive at some point.

Dead Women Crossing, OK, Custer County.


Origin: From an early event?

Origin: Aptly named for tricky navigation.




Body Parts Valley?

Humor and vague shape resemblance?


7 – Just plain odd

Beer Mug Mountain, WY, Carbon County.


Origin: Kinda looked like one when they were drunk?

Dangerous neighborhood, I'll bet.


Knockemstiff, OH, near Chillicothe.

Lotta lightning here?


Zap, ND, Mercer County.

Typo Lake, MN, Anoka and Isanti Counties.


Maybe from a native word?




Name rings a bell?

Origin: Named because two early settlers named Bell had a sign on their store with the bell and the words “Ding-Dong.”




With their minds in a gutter...

Monkeys Eyebrow, KY, near Paducah.


Origin: Possibly due to being in a certain part of a formation that might look like a monkey's head.

Toad Suck, AR, NW of Little Rock.


Origin: It is claimed that river-boatmen would rest there and suck down booze until they swelled like toads.

Big Sucker Brook, NY, near Newcombe.


Origin: Large fish of the sucker variety, I assume.

Booger Hollow, AR, Pope County.


Origin: Folks were scared when passing between two cemeteries.

Doodletown, NY, Rockland County.


Origin: may be from Dutch for “dead valley.”

Korn Krest, PA, near Wilkes-Barre.


Origin: Somehow from settlers named “Korn.”

Origin: Appears to stem from a Native American legend.




In Mount Joy, PA - Nowhere near Little Girls Point.

Said to be from the Lenape language, meaning crayfish.




Did Harry Potter grow up here?

Wait, KY, Wayne County.


Origin: A seller's surname, perhaps.

Nitro, WV, near Charlestown.


Origin: Town built to serve an ammunition plant in WWI.

Chocolate Drops, UT, Wayne County.


Origin: I suspect they look like chocolate drops.

Ordinary, KY, Eliot County.


Origin: Maybe because word once had judicial and ecclesiastic meanings.

Smoky Ordinary, VA, Brunswick County.


Origin: Something to do with smoke, I assume.

Bedrock, CO, Montrose County.


Origin: An outcropping?

Jailhouse Rock, UT, Capital Reef National Park.


Origin: Fancied resemblance to a jail?

Me Own Hill, NM, Sierra County.


Origin: Pirates from somewhere washed up...

Dog Walk, KY, Lincoln County.


Origin: Seems to be lost in obscurity.

Mock City, WA, Fort Joint Base Lewis McChord.


Origin: Actually a mock city for military training.

Origin: Dunno – there isn't even any wood to peck!




Easy for you to say.

No Business Mtn., VA, Patrick County.


Origin: Got me.

Masters and Lackey Cemeteries, Estill County, Kentucky.


Family plots?
